


NEWSLETTER JULY 2022

Happy New Financial Year everyone and Happy Nadoc week. I am happy to report that ATV did not have to declare a COVID-19 outbreak for the month of June. However, a visitor entering the facility who tested positive for COVID-19 a few days after their visit did give us a bit of a scare stating that she did have a runny nose during the visit but thought it was due to hay fever. Luckily, we were able to effectively manage and identify the visitor and the resident, who was then quickly isolated. COVID-19 is still very much present, even though the spotlight has been taken away from it the media, but it is very much still very

present in the Health Care world. A reminder from the General Manager was sent to all family members to ensure that they do not visit ATV if they are a household contact or have flu-like symptoms.

Unfortunately, we are still experiencing a shortage of clinical staff, and the number of staff calling in sick with the cold/flu has increased. The Outbreak Mgt Team is currently reviewing the new guidelines against the ATV COVID-19 outbreak management plan. Over the next few weeks, you will notice some agency staff at ATV. This is the first time since I've been at ATV (8 years) that we have had to call upon agency staff. They will be well orientated to our residents, routines, and duty list, but they don't know our residents as our staff do at ATV. Please make sure you provide feedback to the RN and the Management Team if you can and please support the new staff. That would be much appreciated. Thanking you in advance for your patience.

The annual Food Safety audit is confirmed for the 17th of August 2022. We are in preparation to ensure the Catering staff are ready for the big day and we wish them all the best. I'd like to thank the Catering team and the Maintenance team for working together to make sure preparations are in place. We did have to do some minor maintenance work in the cool room of the main kitchen which has put some pressure on the team, but like the ATV does, we got through it together without affecting productivity and with minimum impact on the residents and the meal service. We are hoping to get another "A" for 2022!

An ATV staff meeting was held on the 30/06/22. The meeting mainly focused on discussing the EBA (Enterprise Bargaining Agreement), the 2023 Financial year Budget, wages, and what the current financial situation in Aged Care is like. We are in a very difficult position with reviewing pay rises for Aged Care staff. Our peak body, the government, and the unions are currently bargaining on what the pay rise should be. The general cost of living will go up by 7% by December, but the Aged Care Industry is being squeezed and there is only a 1.7% funding increase for the industry overall. This is resulting in 64% of RACs' operating at a loss, and, in the past 3 months, eight aged care providers have closed their doors. In all of the serious pay-related meeting, I did forget to present staff with staff recognitions. Staff recognised for their great work for the Month of June went to: Kay (RN), Van (PCA), Kerry (PCA), Joyce (HCP) & Lily (HCP). They were nominated by residents, family members, and their peers. Congratulations guys.

On the positive side, ATV celebrated our two beautiful residents Mrs. Krystyna Jankowska and Mrs. Emily Suryn both turning 100yrs old. On behalf of the Board, the Management, and the staff at Abel Tasman Village, congratulations ladies! We are very proud to

celebrate these moments with you and your families. That's three of our residents we have the honour of celebrating their 100th birthdays with.

The Board and the Management Team finally had the opportunity to take our wonderful volunteers out for their well-deserved "Thank You" lunch last Wednesday. Thank you again Volunteers for your wonderful work and your dedication to our staff and residents at the Abel Tasman Village.

I would like to extend our welcome to the following residents of the Abel Tasman Village; Mr. Victor Hutter, Mr. William Follers, and Mr. Cornelius Merkx. We hope you will make ATV your home away from home.

State of Origin Time


Our home was filled with cheers, laughs and boos as everyone showed their support for their team.
