Hello and welcome to the ATV Homecare article for the February newsletter.

It has been a bit of a topsy turvy month with Elizabett on leave, returning on 30th January 2023. Many thanks to the team, particularly Michelle Axford, for assisting Homecare Clients and staff during this time.

As part of the recommendations from the Royal Commission, pricing for homecare package care and package management fees have been reviewed by the Department and caps have been set as of 1st January 2023. This means that your care management fees will reduce from 1st January 2023. A separate letter has been sent to all Homecare Consumers explaining the changes. We remain available to you to discuss these changes if you need to ask anything.

We are planning to hold a Homecare Information Evening in the next month or two to give our Consumers information in relation to the aged care reforms and changes we can be expecting in the homecare space. Stay tuned for your invitation!

We have also received notification from the Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission that our accreditation visit will be conducted on 21st and 22nd February 2023. Consumers will have the opportunity to be able to speak with the assessors if they wish. Accompanying this newsletter is the notice from Commission and the details for booking a time with the assessors.

As previously explained to you, our software system for the provision of your monthly statement has undergone a complete audit and review. The issues we were experiencing with the integrity of the data which affected our ability to provide you with accurate statements now appear to have been fixed. We apologise for the frustration this has caused you. We certainly did not want to send out incorrect information. We are hoping that statements will now be totally accurate. Of course, if you notice a discrepancy, please contact us immediately for rectification of the issue.

We sadly said farewell to Elizabeth Oonk in the month of January. We send our sincere condolences to Elizabeth's family and friends. Several clients are also in hospital or on respite and we wish them all well.

On the right are Janet and Julie who are from Sefton Parish and have been assisting Clara each Wednesday. Clara recently celebrated her 80th birthday.


































We celebrated Clara's Farewell on Wednesday, 25th January with a lovely mass and morning tea.
