We are pleased to report that there are currently no active cases of COVID-19 at our facility. Although we did have a bit of a scare just before the Easter long holiday where 3 staff members tested positive within a 24hr period. Measures by the team were put in place to reduce any chances of spreading. However, we continue to remain vigilant and follow all recommended infection control protocols to ensure the safety

and well-being of our residents and staff. We appreciate your continued cooperation and support in this effort. The OMT has downgraded the PPE to goggles and surgical masks for staff.

Mother's Day celebration: On Thursday, May 11th, we will be hosting a special Mother's Day celebration to honor all the wonderful mothers and grandmothers in our community for both staff and residents. There will be delicious food and gifts for our female residents and staff as well as live entertainment by Tony Mazzell, a great Italian entertainer who will "woo" the ladies in the audience with his charismatic presence.

Welcome to you all to our May 2023 article,

The Autumn weather has begun with crisp, cool mornings and lovely sunny days to enjoy.

A meet and greet invitation has been delivered to all clients and representatives by snail mail and SMS. We are looking forward to see you Friday, May 5^{th} from 10 - 12 pm. This will be a great session to attend to meet the team and also hear about the Aged Care Reforms coming in the homecare space.

There are changes coming as part of the Aged Care Reforms in aged care:

1.- Consumer Advisory Body:

One of the changes in the homecare environment is the requirement for homecare providers to offer the establishment of a *Consumer Advisory Body*. For Abel Tasman Village (as we have been an approved provider prior to 1/12/22), offers to establish a consumer advisory body must be made at least once a year from 1 December 2023. There will be more information coming to you over the next few months regarding the role and responsibilities of the Consumer Advisory Body. We will also be discussing this reform at the Meet and Greet on 5th May 2023. Stay tuned for more information!

2.- The Work Value Case and the implications this may have on pricing of services:

On 30th June 2023 the wage increase decided upon by the Fair Work Commission for aged care workers will be implemented. The increase to staff wages is 15% on award rates across most classifications in residential and homecare. The entire 15% may not apply to all our workers as our staff work under an Enterprise Agreement and some rates are already above the required increase. These changes may lead to a review in pricing for services as obviously our operational costs will increase. At this stage, the Federal Government has not fully committed to funding the entire increase. We will keep you updated as information comes to hand.

Margaret Russell, is supervising the accounts and billing information coming to you. We know the errors in statements have caused some frustration for you but we are hoping that you may have seen an improvement in the March 2023 statement. Margaret has advised she is available at any time should you have any issues or wish to speak with her. Please call the office on (02) 9645 3388 to speak with Margaret or to make a time for her to visit you.

Ongoing: The Homecare model regarding inclusion & exclusion items. It is important that you consult with me before purchasing items as your care plan needs to be reviewed for this and no reimbursement will be provided unless prior approval has been given.
