

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KEEPING WELL IN WINTER: During the winter months Abel Tasman encourages you, with guidance from your GP, to access the yearly flu shot and any COVID-19 vaccination boosters you are eligible for. We also ask you to be on the lookout for any flu-like symptoms and to please alert our Homecare staff if you feel unwell.

Abel Tasman also encourages you to ask your GP regarding your eligibility for anti-viral medications if you contract an ARI (Acute Respiratory Infection) including COVID-19. Care staff continue wearing masks and taking relevant precautions to keep everyone safe.

Ongoing:

INCLUSIONS AND EXCLUSIONS IN YOUR CARE PLAN:

You are strongly encouraged, should you have an unexpected hospital admission or go on social leave to please let us know. Being absent from your home care service needs to be declared on your home care subsidy with Services Australia. Following any hospital visit your care plan may need to be reviewed and adjusted. If your care needs have changed due to illness, the use of equipment or extra services may need to be modified. This process will be reflected after a consultation and recommendation from your coordinator, registered nurse and the appropriate allied health services.

It is very important to acknowledge and understand the changes of your care needs. If you are purchasing items like equipment, light maintenance works, or other aids, they must be reflected on a new care plan. On that point I have received invoices of purchases that have not been discussed or do not fall under the scope of your care needs. Please note that any requests for reimbursement for items or services that have not been approved, will not be processed.

The process of included & excluded items has been previously provided to you (link at the bottom). Due to this process, reimbursements for purchases outside your care needs scope will not be approved by us as the provider.

Abel Tasman Village needs to comply with all legislation that is relevant in delivering your home care services. Most purchases do fall under a general expense. Please see the communication below sent in November 2022.

Basic rules:

- All purchases must be related to a client's aged care needs and documented in their care plan and included in their annualised budget
- You cannot purchase items that are deemed "excluded" ... no exceptions by doing so, you are breaking the law
- If it is unclear ('grey') if an item can be purchased or not, your provider must demonstrate how they have assessed the suitability of the purchase and linked it to a specified care need in your care plan.

The Aged Care Reforms changes (ongoing):

1.- Consumer Advisory Body:

The establishment of a Consumer Advisory Body which must meet at least once a year from 1 December 2023.

2.- The Work Value Case and the implications this may have on pricing of services:

On 30th June 2023 the wage increase decided upon by the Fair Work Commission for aged care workers will be implemented. These changes may lead to a review in pricing for services as obviously our operational costs will increase. We will keep you updated as information comes to hand.

PRICE CHANGES

You will shortly receive information from ATV regarding proposed changes in the pricing schedule from September 2023. You will be aware that there have been no changes to ATV pricing for some years. The recent pay increases awarded to homecare workers by the Fair Work Commission and the Annual Wage Review have had a significant affect on our expenses and we have no choice but to pass on those increases in a review of pricing. ATV has also compared their pricing to other providers in the homecare space and we are well under the average pricing. Please note that funding levels have increased from 1st July 2023 to partly assist providers in managing expenses. We will be writing to you shortly with clear information on the new schedule and management fees.

I am happy to let you know that I will be making regular visits to assist and support with changes and also encourage you to invite your representative attending those visits.


