FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER





Dear Residents, Families and Staff,

The crisp embrace of Autumn is here but we certainly have some stunning weather with us and we welcome you to the September edition of the Abel Tasman Village newsletter. The garden and the grounds at Abel Tasman look lush and vibrant after the gardening and tree trimming work that was done at the beginning of July. I would like to encourage residents, visitors, and staff to take the opportunity to sit in the garden, or go for a walk around the village, especially through and around the Link building, and take in all the beautiful

natural flora that is on display. We have an exciting array of events and updates to share with you this month, so let's dive right in!

I am happy to report that ATV was free from COVID and Influenza outbreak for the month of August. This is thanks to all of our staff, residents, and friends of ATV who continue to commit to keeping our community safe. COVID-19 is still very much present according to the Department of Health. Nationally there were 95 outbreaks in the residential aged care facilities (RACF), and 27 were from NSW. Despite COVID-19 still having a strong presence in the aged and vulnerable persons sector, restrictions have been further reduced.

We are hoping to reduce the screening process further at the entry of the facility to make your visit more streamlined and accessible. Doing a RAT test prior to entry of a facility is still a strong recommendation. ATV will continue to request visitors to conduct a RAT test when visiting. Staff will also be required to conduct a RAT test prior to coming to work.

However, a staff member will no longer be required to check the result of visitor RAT results. Please do not enter ATV if you are showing any flu-like symptoms or if you have come in contact with someone with COVID-19 in the past 7 days. The Outbreak Management Team is regularly reviewing the latest advice from NSW Health and is now reviewing how to safely open the facility for our end-of-year events for residents and visitors.

As we are in the thick of the flu season, we want to emphasize the importance of taking preventative measures to safeguard our community's health. We strongly encourage all residents to be vaccinated against the flu. The flu vaccine is a safe and effective way to protect yourself and those around you from the influenza virus. We would also strongly recommend family members and visitors be vaccinated against flu so please consult your healthcare provider or visit the local health clinic to schedule your flu shot appointment.

I am happy to report that we have no Covid or influenza outbreak to report. Thank you to staff, visitors, residents, and their families for doing the right thing for our community and keeping everyone at ATV safe. Just a reminder, if you are feeling unwell, please do not visit, even if you have the mildest of symptoms. Flu and gastro are doing the rounds of aged care facilities and we do not want ATV to become affected.

Aged Care Employee Day was on the 7th of August, but ATV decided to celebrate on the 8th of August as the 7th was a Picnic Day. I informally recognised all those staff who have served 10 years and more at ATV. There will be a formal recognition by the Board towards the end of the year. Again, thank you to those who have dedicated themselves to looking after older Australians and making a difference in their lives.

The Annual Food Safety Audit will be held on the 11th of September 2023 at 2pm to observe the dinner service. The Catering Department led by Rodelyn and Karla and Core Management is on track with the preparation for the upcoming audit and I know we will do well. Good luck to the team and let's aim to get another "A" this year.

The Management Team together with the Board is working on the upcoming reforms regarding the "Consumer Advisory Body" and the "Quality Care Advisory Body". I have addressed these upcoming reforms in the Resident Executive and Resident Meetings over the past few meetings and briefly explained how ATV is anticipating rolling these new reforms out. Please refer to the communication below, sent in November 2022.

Basic rules:

- All purchases must be related to a client's aged care needs and documented in their care plan and included in their annualised budget
- You cannot purchase items that are deemed "excluded" ... no exceptions by doing so, you are breaking the
- If it is unclear ('grey') if an item can be purchased or not, your provider must demonstrate how they have assessed the suitability of the purchase and linked it to a specified care need in your care plan.

Other ongoing Aged Care Reforms includes:

1.- Consumer Advisory Body:

The establishment of a Consumer Advisory Body which must meet at least once a year from 1 December 2023.

2.- The Work Value Case and the implications this may have on pricing of services:

On 30th June 2023 the wage increase decided upon by the Fair Work Commission for aged care workers will be

implemented. Please refer to Abel Tasman communication to you regarding pricing increases in relation to your care package in last month's newsletter.

A reminder that the new pricing schedule commences on 1st September 2023. I will be visiting all consumers to revise their Homecare agreement.

I am happy to let you know that I will be making regular visits to assist and support regarding your new budget and updated service agreement. I encourage you to invite your representative to attend those visits once I have confirmed a day and time with you.




