Be reassured you are doing the right thing, and you may have prevented a resident with a cognitive impairment from leaving the facility. We are reviewing gate security and staffing around the incident and will be reviewing and implementing possible improvements in this area. We also ask you, families, and friends, to be extra vigilant regarding resident safety.



Elizabett (Homecare coordinator) and I attended the Voluntary Assisted Dying conference. The Voluntary Assisted Dying Act 2022 passed through NSW Parliament on 19 May 2022. Ongoing: Through previous correspondence you will be aware that from September 1st 2023 our home care fees have increased, you will notice these changes on September statement which should arrive to you mid October 2023. Some clients will also be required to now

pay an **Income Tested Fee (ITF)** as determined by Services Australia. This fee is applicable to those clients who are financially able to contribute towards their care. I will be in touch with those clients who are required to pay this fee.

For those clients who forward invoices to myself for reimbursement, we do aim for a 2 week turnaround on payments coming through to you. Should a payment take longer than 2 weeks please do not hesitate to call Michelle Axford Office Manager and she can follow up payment of your invoice/ reimbursement. We appreciate your patience.

I would also like to mention, that our home care workers are not to pay directly out of their pocket any expenses that may occur while on service. Please ensure you have cash or card available at all times to make your own purchases.

In 2023, the Department of Veterans' Affairs marked the 50th anniversary of the end of Australia's involvement in the Vietnam War. On 18 August 2023, a National Commemorative Service was held at the Australian Vietnam Forces National Memorial on Anzac Parade in Canberra.

It was a day to commemorate the service of some 60,000 Australian men and women who served in the Vietnam War, and the sacrifice of their families. Tragically, 523 Australians lost their lives as a result of the war, and more than 3,000 were wounded.

On Thursday, 9th November at 10.00am we have the honour of the attendance of Mr John Shields who was conscripted in the Vietnam War in 1967. He will be giving us an overview of his involvement in the war.
































A group of residents recently played one game of Tenpin Bowling at Villawood Zone Bowling and Timezone. For many it was their first time and they had a blast.
